The Mayor opened the Public Hearing for "AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF UPPER PITTSGROVE, COUNTY OF SALEM, STATE OF NEW JERSEY PROHIBITING THE OPERATION OF CLASS 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, AND 6 LICENSED CANNABIS BUSINESSES WITHIN THE GEOGRAPHICAL BOUNDARIES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF UPPER PITTSGROVE" known as Ordinance 2021-4 at 7:00PM as advertised.

The Mayor read the Ordinance by title, stating that it had been published in *South Jersey Times* issue of April 29, 2021 as required.

After hearing no comments for or against this Ordinance, the Mayor declared the Public Hearing closed at 7:05PM.

Zeck moved that this ordinance be finally adopted on second reading and that a notice of its adoption be published in the *South Jersey Times* issue of May 14, 2021. This motion was seconded by Seery and adopted upon a call of the roll.

Chris Perez from Rutgers and Cheryl Riordan, ANJEC Project Director gave a brief follow-up presentation before the Township Committee on Green Infrastructure they planned for the Municipal Garage. This project was to help preserve the Delaware River Water Shed and would be totally funded by outside sources. The plans were the same as previously submitted at the September 8, 2020 meeting. Public Works Superintendent, Brian Coles stated that he saw no issue with where the garden was to be located. Cimprich made a motion to approve the Rain Water Garden project. This motion was seconded by Seery and adopted unanimously.
